


Within the LA block, what should we define as common expectations needed in every classroom?

Threats to Validity

- Our own history with writing and with individual students colors how we score writing.
- Be aware of some personal "red buttons" you have when scoring writing. (Once upon a time.... It was all a dream....a lot)
- Keep an anchor paper and reread it after every 4 papers to recalibrate.
- Score papers as a team to understand the thinking of other teachers

RTI Changes for Next Year- Challenges

Teacher comment that classroom is "revolving door" and it's hard to catch everyone up

Students in Tier 2/3 are being pulled out of core instruction for Tier Services.

In 2014, iLabs were closed 10 weeks for Universal Screeners, Mock, and STAAR.

We do not have equity of opportunity for students in 1b. There is different quality and quantity of 1b services by grade level team.

Bilingual Interventionists have a higher case load and additional duties.

There is not a collaborative team structure to gather feedback from all stakeholders with RtI

Successfully treamlined versal Testing.

RTI Changes for Next Year- Changes

Add Consultation Time for Bil. Inter. for "Other Duties". Train Bilingual Assistant for W-M and "Other Duties"

Use EOY data to begin Rtl groups in BOY

Decrease the number of days iLab is closed through from 50 days to 15 days.

For Mock, most SOA can be done in the classroom with online testing.

Change RtI time expectations so that most students are not pulled out during core instruction.

Master Schedule includes 45 mins for Rtl

AH Currently 1b: 80- 150 minutes per week

**(adds more flexibility to try other options before moving to Tier 3)

Tier 2 Dual Needs: 2 days of 45 mins and 3 days of 30 mins

Proposed Tier 3: 150-300 minutes per week

Tier 3 Dual Needs: 5 days of 45 mins

Rtl Changes- (9:00 small group)


